

Item Summary

This workshop is for Council discussion of the One Cent Sales Tax for Streets and Open Space and the Streets Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2010 through 2016.

An overview of status of projects designed for reconstruction, the list of candidate streets for pavement rehabilitation, and streets identified for pavement preservation will be discussed.

Updated revenue projections over the next five years will be presented, along with One Cent Fund obligations, for discussion of financing options such as issuing debt and/or pay as you go for reconstruction projects, rehabilitation of existing streets, and pavement preservation.

Recommended Action: No action is required; although Council may desire to provide guidance for program direction, financing and FY 11 budget preparation.




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Item Summary

This item is to discuss "fees in lieu of" construction of on-site stormwater infrastructure allowed under Land Development Code Section 14.4 - 'Off-Site Improvements'.

The City of Prescott Stormwater Management Program (SWMP) provides for the planning, design, and construction of drainage improvements necessary for the development of property. A regional SWMP provides a watershed-wide approach to analysis of potential flooding problems, identification of appropriate mitigation measures, and selection of suitable sites where regional drainage improvements will provide greater overall benefit in a given area. Fees paid by owners of new private development projects, in-lieu of construction of on-site drainage improvements, can provide necessary revenue for the cost of regional drainage facilities, where determined appropriate. Potential improvements may include detention ponds, existing drainage channelization improvements, conveyance system improvements and voluntary buyout of private property within floodways.

Developer participation in the program is voluntary. Individual projects will be evaluated to verify that implementation of regional drainage improvements will produce measurable offsite benefits and to assure no adverse impacts will occur downstream as a result of not constructing on-site drainage improvements.

Not all projects will be eligible for the program. Regional improvements will only be implemented where feasible and advantageous.

Recommended Action: No Council action is required at this time.
